

AIR CONDITIONING!!!

Last spring, the decision was made to air condition **Sims' Store** and museum in order to protect the volunteers and artifacts from the ever-increasing summer heat. We elected to air condition the lunch room, the upstairs storage room, the mural room and the dollhouse room with units that allow us to direct airflow down the stairs and from the mural room down into the gallery.

Of our three bids, **Barth Heating and Air Conditioning**, a small firm with a very good reputation, provided the best proposal, offering the best product at slightly more than the lowest bid. We approached the town for funding, but were advised that because of our other financial priorities (principally funding a new, full-time coordinator) it was very unlikely that the board would approve the \$16,000 needed. This fall we kicked off a fundraising campaign and in a very short time we received enough donations to cover the inflated price of \$19,500. On December 20 and 21 the system was installed. Since it is a heat pump as well as air conditioner, we are currently heating most of the building at one third the cost of the old baseboard heat system. We wish to thank all who contributed and are looking forward to increased comfort for volunteers and visitors to the museum!

In The Canal. - This morning a disconsolate team, used for propelling purposes on the raging canal, made a bold strike for freedom from the galling servitude of the driver's lash and the discouraging tow-line, by running away at full speed down the tow-path below the lock just above the bridge. They were having a successful run of it, and bid fair to accomplish their purpose, when the tow-path came to an abrupt termination near the foundation of the new building being erected on the east end of the bridge.

As they were running lively it was found impossible to stop suddenly, and as a consequence they sheered. The sheer resulted in one of them being thrown into the canal. The other was soon in a like predicament. A crowd collected. Nothing like a horse in the canal and a dog fight to attract a crowd. The horses struggled frantically. It was a cold bath, why shouldn't they struggle?

"A benevolent individual seized a gangway, and with the help of the crowd the animals were reinstated to their former position in the community. Moral, applicable to all canal horses; you can't make the foundation of a building get off of your track when you run away.

TUPELO GROVE

For many years we have had a tupelo tree salt pipe exhibit on the edge of our main parking lot at **Sims' Store**. It attracted little attention as visitors parked their cars and went elsewhere in the park. These wooden pipes carried the brine from the Tully salt wells to the salt processing area at the foot of Onondaga Lake. There it was either boiled off or evaporated in the sun.

Our work party crew decided to relocate the exhibit to a newly cleared space near the pavilion. They carefully used as much of the old material as was in good enough condition to reconstruct on the new site. With considerable effort they dug new postholes for placing the uprights in concrete. Most of the old roof was useable. The crew are constructing a graded pipe holder to support the tupelo pipes. John Meldrum spearheaded the effort with expert precision, with great assists from Jim Murphy, Joe Menzel, Dave Holzhauer, Bill Kunkle, Don Mosher, Richard Seubert, John Winks, Ed Morgan and Hayden Jones.

Our two large salt kettles will be moved so they flank the exhibit. The area will be known as the **"Tupelo Grove".** It will be a welcoming area for visitors, either to enjoy the exhibit or to just relax in the shady grove. **Ron Cottet** has begun to refurbish the **Tupelo Exhibit** signs.
