

EMPIRE STATE TRAIL

The great Empire State Trail is finally open from Canada to Long Island and Buffalo to Albany



Locally, the long awaited trail connecting Route173 passing Gere Lock to the Onondaga Lake West Shore Trail is open, including a new bridge over the CSX railroad tracks at the southeast end of the lake. The path continues to Hiawatha Boulevard via the Creek Walk to Armory Square. From there the Erie Boulevard East Trail utilizes the median strip to DeWitt, which then connects to the Butternut Creek Aqueduct trail over a new Route 481 bridge. Now riders can easily navigate from Camillus to Dewitt and continue their journey toward Albany.

REPAIR OF LEAKS IN THE CANAL


In early December, three leaks in the canal were repaired by the Town of Camillus. The leaks were on the berm side, one located by the aqueduct and the other two located a short distance away from the aqueduct. We are happy to have them repaired to maintain canal water level. Last fall the water was exceptionally low and then the water level had to be lowered even more to fix the leaks. With the help of snow melt and April showers. boat rides have returned on Wednesdays and Sundays.



GERE'S LOCK

We have been leasing the lock area for over 45 years from Allied Chemical and Honeywell. In the past, bulldozers pushed the four top layers of the lock wall into the chamber, to avoid anyone from falling into them. It would have been a better idea to fill in the chambers with dirt, which would have been much easier to restore.

We have submitted partial restoration plans to Honeywell. With our gratitude, they cleared all of the trees from the lock, towpath and berm, which was phase one. Our canal group has constructed a whipple type bridge over the head of the berm lock chamber for access to the trail. Future plans call for an elevated walkway within the towpath and berm lock chambers. The parking lot will be completed and connected to the bike trail. This lock, No. 50 on the First Erie Canal Enlargement (1845), is a prototype lock with many features which we will explore in a future article. We sincerely thank our group for grass cutting and construction, and Honeywell for its generosity.

First he would give you grief, and the next thing you knew whatever needed repair was done. Bob was a great chef who shared some of his trade secrets. We were elated when we found out that we had a resident blacksmith and he generously shared his talents with us on Towpath Day. Thank you Bob. You were the best!!

Marge Tyler and her husband, Bill, were longtime volunteers and very good friends with Dottie and Craig Nunneker. We always remember Bill trying to blow out his hat that was riddled with burn holes.
