

## Cycle the Erie Tour ~ Open House Event

The Liz and Dave Beebe Camillus Erie Canal Park is expecting 300 cyclists to visit on July 14<sup>th</sup> between 10 am and 2 pm. They will be riding the Empire Erie Canalway from Buffalo to Albany on July 11-14 in conjunction with the NY State Park's "*Cycle the Erie Tour*." The park will sponsor an Open House event. The public is invited to come greet the riders and hear about their experiences. Cyclists will be welcomed to the store - the "*Halfway There*" point - with cowbells and signs at this exciting midpoint on their journey. Many riders commemorate it by mailing a postcard from our own little Post Office. An amazing variety of goodies are provided to the riders by NY's Park Trek and we will complement them by offering hotdogs, brownies and cookies.

Music will be provided by the **Soda Ash Jazz Band**.\*\* Visitors will be able to join tours of the museum and take an hour narrated aqueduct boat tour that highlights the history and culture of the canal era. They can also see a lock demonstration and explore a section of the original Clinton's Ditch.

It is exciting to note that within our park we have the remains or replicas of all structures necessary to operate a canal:

The original Clinton's Ditch
The first enlargement of the canal
A feeder
A culvert
A replica of a lock shanty
An aqueduct

Our steam engine is a truly unique opportunity to see a fully restored turn-of-the-century steam powered Corliss Engine and learn about the technology that propelled the Industrial Revolution in America.

Leaving the Park, cyclists continue to ride the trail toward Syracuse passing the remnants of Gere's Lock. This trail segment will be a wonderful immersion in canal history as riders enjoy recreational activities and the natural beauty of Central New York.

Linda Vishnesky led our first ride of the season to introduce cyclists to the fairly new trail from Route 173 by Reed Webster Park in Camillus to Gere Lock. The new trail winds through the old waste beds enabling riders to experience a variety or terrain and abundant wildlife. When riders gathered at Gere Lock, **Dave Beebe** explained the towpath lock and the berm. Volunteers made a new bridge over the 18' wide lock to the berm which leads down to the Geddes Brook culvert. We'll gather again at the CSZ new bridge to learn about eagles and local history. Other rides will take cyclists to Chittenango, Oneida, Syracuse, Manlius, Fayetteville, and Wayne County.
