

Meet Lisa Wiles

We are pleased to introduce **Lisa Wiles** as the new coordinator of the **Liz and Dave Beebe Camillus Erie Canal Park**.

Lisa is originally from the Rochester area where she spent approximately 20 years working in non-profit organizations. How lucky that she happened to hear of the opening at our park just at the time she was job hunting. She comes to us with experience working with volunteers of all ages, an interest in education, and also in the history of NY and the Erie Canal. Her special interest is the social aspect of history and how it explains how many of the events and people of past times influence how society works today.

She has worked at the Seneca Park Zoo, The Humane Society of Rochester, Special Olympics, and Children Awaiting Parents (an organization supporting foster children awaiting adoption) among others. Lisa's interests revolve around outdoor education in non-classroom settings. For instance, at the Humane Society, she involved adult and child volunteers, and started a Lollypop Farm Camp where kids worked with the animals and helped care for them. Lisa created a number of events where organizations partnered with business and volunteers for the benefit of children and animals. She hopes to continue those efforts here to involve more local kids at the canal.

Lisa most recently worked as a pharmacy tech at Fairmount Wegmans during the worst of the pandemic. Her experience, vast and varied, with people in any number of settings, will serve us well as she organizes and directs visitors and volunteers alike to continually work and play along our piece of canal.

Lisa is married to Dan Wiles. He is the director of the Port Byron Erie Canal Park which she sees as an opportunity for collaborative activities. She worked with the Wiles family on their canal boats carrying guests along the Erie Canal. She understands first hand seasonal trends and how it affects tourism along the canal.

Lisa is working on getting to know all aspects of the canal park. Since she is technically an employee of the Town of Camillus, she also serves as the liaison between the two.

The experience, interests and skills Lisa brings seem to be a perfect match to our mission statement which lists the purpose of the park as preservation, recreation, and education. Lisa has an interest and experience in every one of these areas. We hope to use her talents to further all of these goals.

The education videos, written by members of the education committee and produced by our local **Channel 9**, are an excellent overview of our park. The museum information centered on how the canal came to be and what life was like at the time. Volunteers demonstrated an interactive display of artifacts available to visitors to experience the way laundry was done on canal boats.

On the grounds, there was an overview of the *Catherine* boat, the gardens, the buoy boat, the lock pavilion, the lock gates, and the lifeboat from the *Dave Peckinpaugh*.

It was an informative and fun day.

Visit to Jordan ~ April 9

Dave Beebe led a group over to **Jordan Lock 51** on Route 31 just outside the village where it is maintained by NYSDOT. The group walked through the limestone walled chamber while Dave recounted significant features of this lock. Perhaps most important is its excellent condition, remarkable since it was watered in 1845. In the 1880's, a Garley turbine was installed in the overflow channel that powered a rod with loose lines attached to help pull the boat out of the lock. Rope wear marks and lifting holes are evident at the west end of the lock. One reason why the lock was so well preserved is that someone who watched over it lived in its lock shanty for a number of years.

The next stop was at the **Brambly Library** where the **Jordan Historical Society Museum** is nestled in the library in the **Horace W. Whitley Community Center**. **Gary Klink**, one of our volunteer boat captains, was our host. He and his colleagues have been working hard to ready the displays for a new season of visitors. Among the most interesting displays is one of the original lanterns which was mounted on the lock for night lockages. Jordan was known for manufacturing wheelbarrows, many of which were used while building the canal. A dumping wheelbarrow can be seen at the museum. There was an excellent collection of Jordan pottery. They actually have the 7 lb. cannon ball which was fired as a salute to Lincoln's funeral train as it passed through Jordan on April 27, 1865. It became embedded in a tree, a section of which is located in this treasure of a museum.

From the Library the group walked to nearby Skaneateles Creek. The stream swept by under the arches of the Jordan Aqueduct. Further on they were able to view more of the canal bed and see a small dry dock. In the distance was the Jordan Lock shanty. Finally, they visited the **Veterans Memorial** on Main Street to view the canal murals commissioned by **Jean Carrington**, one of our benefactors.
